COST OF LIVING

The Dallas-Fort Worth area is very large. There is a distance of more than 80 miles between the SW corner of Fort Worth and the NE corner of the Dallas suburbs. As a result the price of living will be directly affected by which part of the DFW area you decide to live in.

Our academy has locations in Little Elm, The Colony, Murphy, Frisco and Forney. As a result we recommend you look for something in the proximity of where you will be teaching. Good locations to look into are West Plano, North Plano, Richardson, or Little Elm or The Colony if you will be teaching near The Colony, Little Elm or Frisco. You can also look into Plano, Murphy, Richardson or North Dallas if you will be teaching in Murphy or Forney.



ABOUT THE DALLAS Fort Worth Area



You will find the DFW average cost of living for the different major things:

- A studio in the DFW has a current average rent price of \$1,050 per month.
- Groceries, utilities and entertainment costs fall on average with the overall cost of living in the United States.
- Transportation: Although gas has 25% lower price in Texas than in the rest of the country, the distances are big. As a result, the cost of transportation will depend on how much you drive.

LOCATIONS


Franco Racquet Sports has agreements with different cities, school districts and private entities throughout the DFW. As a result we have a number of tennis courts that we use. The best way to understand the locations of the courts we use is here:

Don't be deceived by distances and make sure you always look them up on Google Maps. For example the driving distance between our location in Forney and our location in The Colony is about 1 hour and 10 Minutes.

TRANSPORTATION

As mentioned above the DFW area is extensive geographically. As a result public transportation only covers very few and important areas via buses and rapid trains. However, due to the large distances everyone living in the DFW will need a car to move around reliably.







COACHES MINIMUM STANDARD EQUIPMENT

This is the minimum standard equipment you will need to have with you at all times so that we can provide a consistent and quality service.

The investment on the equipment is yours since you are an Independent contractor, as such equipment brought to the lesson should be purchased by you.

- At least 45 Red Balls
- At least 72 Orange Balls
- At least 85 Yellow Balls
- 6 Regular Cones
- 12 Flat Cones
- 1 Agility Ladder
- 1 Jump Rope
- 1 Resistance Band
- Racquet Grip Bands Multicolor (These will be provided upon request)



Only exception is with the balls. (i.e. If you don't have students younger than 8 you won't need red balls, if you don't have students younger than 11 you won't need orange balls, etc). The moment you are assigned a student within said age group you will need to send the office proof of equipment.



COACH CAREER PATH

This is the career path you can follow to have more responsibility and increase your pay. You don't necessarily have to follow it but know it is an option.

Coach - Level 1 - Recreational Coach

- Less than 750 Hour of tennis instruction experience
- USPTA Recreational Certification or Franco Tennis Academy suggested Courses
- Teaches an average of 10+ Hours weekly

Coach - Level 2 - Professional Coach

- Less than 2,000 Hours of tennis instruction experience
- USPTA Professional Certification or PTR Professional Certification
- Takes at least 2 USPTA courses or suggested Franco Racquet Sport Courses every year
- Teaches an average of 15+ Hours weekly

Coach - Level 3 - Elite Coach

- At least 4,000 Hours of tennis coaching experience with different groups of students including juniors, adults and high performance
- USPTA Elite Certification or PTR Elite Certification
- Maintain USPTA or PTR accreditation through taking credits on a yearly basis
- Teaches an average of 20+ Hours Weekly

You can lead city programs, or take full ownership of a city on your own as a program owner and can expect hourly increases of between 15 to 30% from what you made as a professional coach. Percentage increase will depend on your metrics, how long you have been with the program and what your base was as a recreational coach (KPI's).



HOURS AND RESULTS

Just like anywhere else you will start working a base number of hours (10 more or less) with us. In the weeks following you joining us you will receive more students until you have a full schedule with as many hours as you want to teach (Minimum 15 or 20, depending on your situation). Unlike other academies and country clubs we help you by providing you the customers so you build your portfolio of lessons. Great coaches maintain an average of 25 - 30 Hours of lesson per week.

Although we provide coaches with students we also expect coaches to provide a positive experience. Here is how you will be measured:

- How much turnover you have on your customers
 - A good experience the majority of times means your customer will stay with you through longer periods of time. This will require continuous communication with customers and genuinely caring for them.
- Customer Referral
 - How many new students join the academy because they saw you on court and inquired from you.
- Communication with the office
 - We work as a team and that will require frequent communication with the office to share, lessons canceled, incidents, challenges and achievements. Making sure you communicate effectively will help us provide a better experience as a team.

OTHER DETAILS:

You will have a contractual obligation to avoid teaching tennis in the 7 mile radius around the areas where we currently have programs, and would strongly encourage you to engage in other types of jobs if you wish to work elsewhere in your spare time to avoid confusions on breach of contract.





TOPICS TO CONSIDER TO GET STARTED

Make sure you understand where you will be teaching the majority of your lessons. Ask us - We can help you by recommending places to live near where you will be teaching. It will be up to you to make appointments to look for houses or apartments and ask for pricing. We can assist you in taking you on apartment tours for one or two days.

A good starting strategy is to rent a room on a month by month basis while you get your feet on the ground, set up your monthly budget and ramp up your hours. It will cost you significantly less, you will be committed for much less time and you will get to know the area and dynamics of work before you commit to renting something long term.

You will need a car - You can either buy a used car in good shape (Old but with low mileage, 70,000 or less) and finance it over a number of months so that it fits your budget. Usually with \$170 you will be good to go. Remember you will also need to budget insurance for the car, gas and tolls.



Depending on your status you will be either considered a part time employee or independent contractor with 20+ hours a week. Most of our coaches are independent contractors. In that case you will have to file and pay your own taxes. The best thing to do in such cases will be to keep every expense as it relates to tennis lessons (i.e sunblock, water, clothes for tennis, mileage from and to lessons, racquets, balls and any expense as it relates to tennis). You will be able to deduct all these expenses from your taxes at the end of the year.

Once the calendar year ends you will need to file your taxes from that year. You usually have until mid-April to do the filing. An easy way to do it is to use TurboTax. You will need to have received a 1099- Misc form from us or a W2. You will receive those from us before January 31st.

TOPICS TO CONSIDER TO GET STARTED



HEALTH

It will be your responsibility to look for health insurance. However we encourage you to look at Sidecar Health. Although they are not insurance they do cover on average 80% of health expenses and usual visits. You can also look at the marketplace (Healthcare.Gov) where they will ask you what your estimated income is and then tell you if you qualify for subsidy and how much insurance will cost you. If you go down this route you want to be conservative and tell the agent on the phone a bit of an overestimate of what you will make.

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SEASONALITY

You should be able to teach at least 20 hours the great majority of weeks throughout the year. However, there are times of the year such as the last two weeks of December and first week of January where things slow down. This is a time where coaches usually go on vacation. Furthermore, you can expect December, January and February to make income equivalent to 70% of what you would make in any other month. So <u>make sure you budget for</u> those months ahead of time and that way you have no issue during those months.

SOCIAL LIFE

Meeting people outside of work is a key part of being happy and healthy. Here are some ideas of activities that you can do to meet other people:

- See who in your network is in the area.
- Ask your closest friends if they know someone in the area they can introduce you to.
- Volunteer for a group
- Join a social fitness club like November Project or Running Clubs.
- Join Meetup groups like the 20's and 30's something in Dallas.
- Hangout with your co-workers



VISA INFORMATION

We usually have students join as students on an OPT and provide some admin work that aligns with the major they studied. A few months into the OPT we start working toward your visa. Although there is a high likelihood you will get the visa no one can guarantee that you will get it as there are many factors that go into the decision.

The visa requires you to work 20 Hours a week with us and allows you to work additional hours in other job(s) as you would like. The visa is valid for two years and will give you the opportunity to ask for permanent residency in the United States.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Do you do more than one year of sponsorship? - How long?

• Yes, after you complete one year with the OPT we can sponsor you for 2 more

Is there a possibility to do some admin work?

• Yes, most hours you work will be on the court, but the remaining hours you have can be put towards admin work

Is there a possibility to grow within the company? - How?

• There is the possibility to grow. Just like in every company it takes time. Based on your skills, achievements, proactiveness and years of experience you are able to move up.

Is there room and board?

• No

Do you pay for my expenses? (Gas, equipment, etc)

• We give you a starting bonus of \$2,000 which you use for these purposes or to help you out if you do not have a car. Other than that all expenses are covered by you.

How much experience do you have with OPT students?

• We do have experience with coaches that were international student athletes just like you and that are willing to sit down with you and explain their experience and how things work. However we haven't directly employed anyone with an OPT directly.

How many hours do I have to/can I work?

• Minimum 20 hours, as many as you want, but the schedule will probably limit you to a maximum of about 30.

How does payment work?

• You get paid every Monday based on the hours you worked during the previous week

How do my classes work in the winter months?

• Winter months in the DFW area are January and February. You will have scheduled lessons during winter months, however there is an increased cancellation rate during those months due to weather. We will help out with admon hours if there are weeks where you can't complete 20 Hours of teaching on the court.

Can I work another job besides the one I have with you guys?

• Yes, as long as there is no conflict of interest and that it is not in the same field of work

How long of a commitment do I have to have with you?

• A minimum of 2 years
